The Gorge is no more than 5 -6 miles from the town centre and easily accessed by car.

For those using public transport, two buses leave Telford bus station at regular intervals throughout the day.

Taxis are plentiful, costing up to £25 per journey for 4. There is also a Uber service which can be a little more competitive.
